

Step 1

Getting Started: Orientation and Overview

With a focus on foundational prayer -including recruiting a prayer team- plus short articles and Bible studies covering: 1) the fundamentals of the Christian faith, 2) heart change, and 3) the importance of Scripture, this step will get you off to a solid start.

A Good Foundation

By digging into two key books in this section, you will become more grounded in your faith and begin to process the critical issue of heart change. Take the time to write down key lessons learned in this foundational step.

Moving Ahead

A key resource in this step explains how the Bible is one continuous story of God's love for us. You can learn and then explain this to your child. Another short book shares practical guidance on living your faith as a family. More family activities are introduced in this step.

Step 7

Understanding and Explaining Faith

Key resources are introduced in this step to help children begin to deal with tough questions and be prepared to answer them. Family discussions and outings are continued in this step. Parents learn how to recognize signs of real conversion in their child.

Introducing Spiritual Disciplines

Through one of two books on Spiritual Disciplines, you help your child learn practices to grow their faith. This step also continues the focus on character development and encourages you to assess your child's character while becoming specific in your parenting plans. Readings and outings continue.

Sticky Faith and Teachable Moments

Learn what makes faith stick and how to take advantage of teachable moments in this step. Add in Scripture memory CD's and suggested meal-time discussions and family outings to keep the momentum going. Don't forget for you and your prayer team to continue praying!

Step 5

Learning More about How God Made Your Child

In this critical step, the focus is on learning about the unique personality and qualities of your child and beginning the process of character development. Sections of two books are used, plus special outings and family readings begin.
